The **Plain Language Brochure (CH 1233)** has considerably less content than the letter-fold but still covers the key messages for parents about crying, and coping with crying, as well as SBS. This is also useful in many contexts but is a good fit when parents have lower literacy levels or are looking for an easy-to-read source of information. This brochure lends itself well to being included in larger packages of information such as those that parents receive at discharge from hospital after delivery, program orientation packages, etc. This brochure is also available on the website in Arabic, Farsi, French, Hindi, Korean, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Spanish, Traditional Chinese, Urdu, and Vietnamese are available.

The **Crying Plan (CH 1234)** is intended for use as a handout or as an exercise where parents can write in personal information about supports in their families and communities. The **Letter Fold Brochure (CH 1235)** is adaptable to many circumstances but is particularly good for use in waiting rooms – social services, hospitals, doctors offices, clinics, community agencies serving families, etc. where people may take the time to read all of the information included.
